Dress Code and Appearance for the Sacraments

First Penance -"Sunday best": pants and nice shirt.

First Communion - No jeans or sneakers

Boys: Suit, blazers or dress sweaters, dress slacks and dress shoes. Ties **MUST** be worn.

<u>Girls:</u> Traditional white dress and a head piece (veil, circle of etc.) - NO slacks or pants.

REQUIREMENTS FOR FIRST PENANCE AND FIRST HOLY COMMUNION

- 1. A Copy of a Baptismal Certificate **MUST** be submitted to the Religious Education office.
 - Students in the Religious Education Program: Certificates are required at the time of registration.
 - Students in St. Timothy School: Certificates are collected at the school, who will give them to the Religious Education Office.
 - Any students that were baptized at St. Timothy Catholic Church must still submit a baptismal certificate, which can be requested from the parish office.
- 2. Students need to memorize the following prayers:

The Ten Commandments Act of Contrition Our Father Hail Mary Glory Be

The Communion Prayer recited during Mass:

"Lord I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed."

- 3. Students should study, <u>The New Saint Joseph First Communion Catechism</u> in its entirety. This text is designed to help prepare your child for the sacraments of Penance and reception of the Eucharist.
- 4. First Communion candidates should regularly attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of obligation.
- 5. The students are strongly encouraged to accompany their family when going to Confession. In preparation for your child's First Communion, it is important for them to go to confessions. Confessions are heard in the Church each Saturday from 3:30P.M. to 5:00P.M., and Wednesday 11:30-11:50A.M. & 8:00P.M.

- 6. Attendance is mandatory for all children in sacramental preparation classes. This includes grades: 1,2 & 7, 8 and Missing Sacrament classes. Students preparing for a sacrament who miss 3 or more *unexcused* classes will not be recommended to the Pastor for the reception of the sacrament.
 - An absence is considered <u>excused</u> when a parent contacts the Religious Education Office and the student completes any missed work at home.
- 7. A sacramental fee of \$30 is charged to defer the cost of supplies in preparation for the Sacrament of First Holy Communion. This fee is paid at the time of registration.

PHOTOGRAPHY

We are requesting that **NO PHOTOGRAPHY** take place during Mass. The holy sacrifice of the Mass is a most sacred time in which Christ is present. It is a time where all attention should be focused on Our Lord in the Eucharist. Remember that your child will be receiving the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ. Movement in the church is a distraction, not just for the children but for everyone.

CLASS PICTURES

There will **not** be a professional photographer for the sacraments. Individual teachers might organize their class for a picture in the courtyard.

BASIC STEPS FOR RECEIVING THE EUCHARIST

To help prepare your child to receive the Eucharist reverently on the day of their First Holy Communion, please review the following.

Receiving the Host on the tongue is the method taught in religious education classes. **All** First Communicants are expected to receive on the tongue at the First Holy Communion Mass.

- 1. Bow before you walk to the priest. Keep your hands folded in prayer.
- 2. When the Priest or other ministers will hold up the Blessed Sacrament and say "The Body of Christ".
- 3. You reply "Amen". This "Amen" means you believe the Eucharist is the Body and Blood of Jesus.
- 4. Then, tilt your head slightly back, open your mouth wide and extend your tongue.
- 5. The priest or minister will place the Sacred Host on your tongue.
- 6. Wait until the Sacred Host is safely placed on your tongue before you return your tongue inside your mouth and close it.
- 7. Make the Sign of the Cross and walk back to your seat in the pew.
- 8. Once back in your pew, kneel down and say a prayer, thanking God.

THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

Below are some suggestions for you to use in helping your child prepare for the Sacrament of Penance.

- 1. Help your child to learn the Ten Commandments. Please use the St. Joseph First Communion Catechism book to go over the Commandments, the examination of conscience and how to make a good confession as often as you can.
- 2. Work with your child to learn the basic prayers, especially the Act of Contrition, Our Father and the Hail Mary.
- 3. Role-play "going to Confession". (Don't use real sins when role playing; make up some false sins).
- 4. Teach your child that to sin is to say "No" to God. Make sure your child understands the difference between a mistake or accident, temptation, and sin by talking about some typical situations, which illustrate these occurrences.
- 5. Remind your child how loving God is and how much He is overjoyed when anyone comes to Him to confess their sins.

ACT OF CONTRITION

Oh my God, I am deeply sorry for having offended You. I detest all my sins because of Your just punishments, but most of all because they offend You, my God, Who are all good and deserving of all my love.

I firmly resolve, with the help of Your grace, to confess my sins, to do penance, and to amend my life. Amen.

CHILDREN'S FORM FOR CONFESSION

Child: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Bless me, Father, for I have sinned.

It has been _____ weeks since my last Confession. (Or this is my first Confession.

These are my sins: (Name the sins.)

When finished, say:

For these sins and the sins of my whole life, I am sorry.

Priest: Gives words of advice and suggestions.

Asks child to say a penance (prayers to be said in Church after Confession.

Child: Say the Act of Contrition (See page 6 of this handbook)

or

An Act of Contrition you have memorized.

Priest: Gives Absolution (the prayer which removes one's sins)

Child: Thank you Father.
