Thanks to the generosity of you, our parishioners, a wonderful family was able to face an unexpected financial crisis without going into debt or falling into despair.

The SVdP Helpline received a message from Maria's* coworker who said this young lady was facing a health crisis in her family which resulted in a financial emergency. We arranged a home visit with Maria to find out how we could help. Two SVdP members visited Maria and learned that she was a 24-year-old; carrying the weight of her household on her shoulders.

Maria's family included her parents and two younger sisters. Up to then, the sole providers of the household had been Maria and her father, and between the two of them, they were able to cover rent and all of their household bills.

Two weeks before, however, Maria's father was hospitalized, diagnosed with a rare and debilitating disease, and expected to be out of commission for a long period of time. When we spoke to Maria, her father was still in the hospital and her mother, who is not fluent in English, was staying by his bedside night and day. Maria was now the sole earner in the family; dividing her time between her full-time job, visits to the hospital, and taking care of her younger sisters and the household. Maria was feeling overwhelmed about keeping up with the bills, especially the rent and car payment. As we listened to Maria, we were impressed by her maturity and the obvious love she had for her family.

Thanks to your generosity, Maria was able to pay the rent and other bills. She no longer felt so alone and was able to plan for the future.

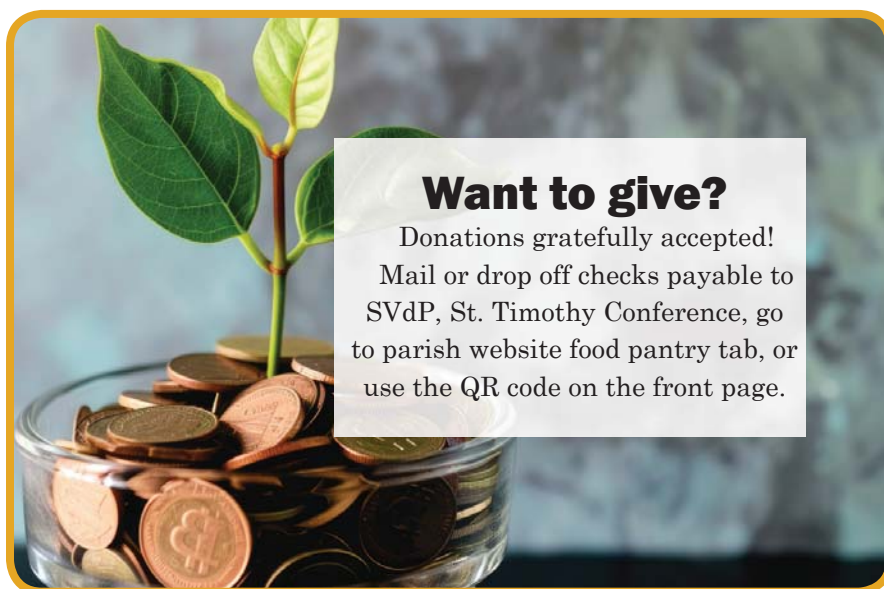


A Blue (but Happy) Christmas

New Members, New Blessings

SVdP members are a vital resource, when it comes to supporting the needs of our community, and newer members bring fresh ideas, energy, diversity, and joy!

A warm welcome to our newest members: James and Maria H., Mike and Marge P., Len R. and MaryRose V. These active members are serving others through our food pantry, monitoring helpline calls, and/or casework.

New members are gently guided into conference activities through a mentoring program, participation in conference meetings and a one-day Ozanam Orientation. This orientation, named after our founder Frederic Ozanam, provides an overview of the various aspects of the Society, including the history, spirituality, understanding poverty, and the home visit.



Helping Others is Seeing the Face of Christ

New conference member, Mike, shares some impressions on his first home visit with a companion SVdP member. They joined in a Vincentian prayer, before knocking on the apartment door, as a reminder of why they were there. They encountered a young couple with an energetic puppy, but no other household members. After a brief explanation of the SVdP mission, he “immediately focused on the neighbors, to understand their situation, the composition of the household, and their needs.” By the end of their visit, Mike shared, “they were very receptive to our guidance and offers of further assistance. We left on a very cordial note, with an offer to provide food from the food pantry [as well].”

When asked how the home visit differed from other encounters with neighbors, Mike added, “while the encounters at the church offices were very [pleasant], open, and successful, the intimacy of the home visit felt more in the spirit of the founders.” SVdP founders placed emphasis on a Christ centered encounter, in which the Vincentian sees the face of Christ in the poor (a Vincentian charism) and the neighbor sees Christ in the Vincentian. Each encounter strives toward the Vincentian virtues of simplicity, humility, gentleness, selflessness, and zeal.

Thanks to you, our parishioners, we were able to deliver “immediate monetary relief for utilities, and food and gift cards for sustenance, but most importantly, we did open the door to the spirit of Christ.”

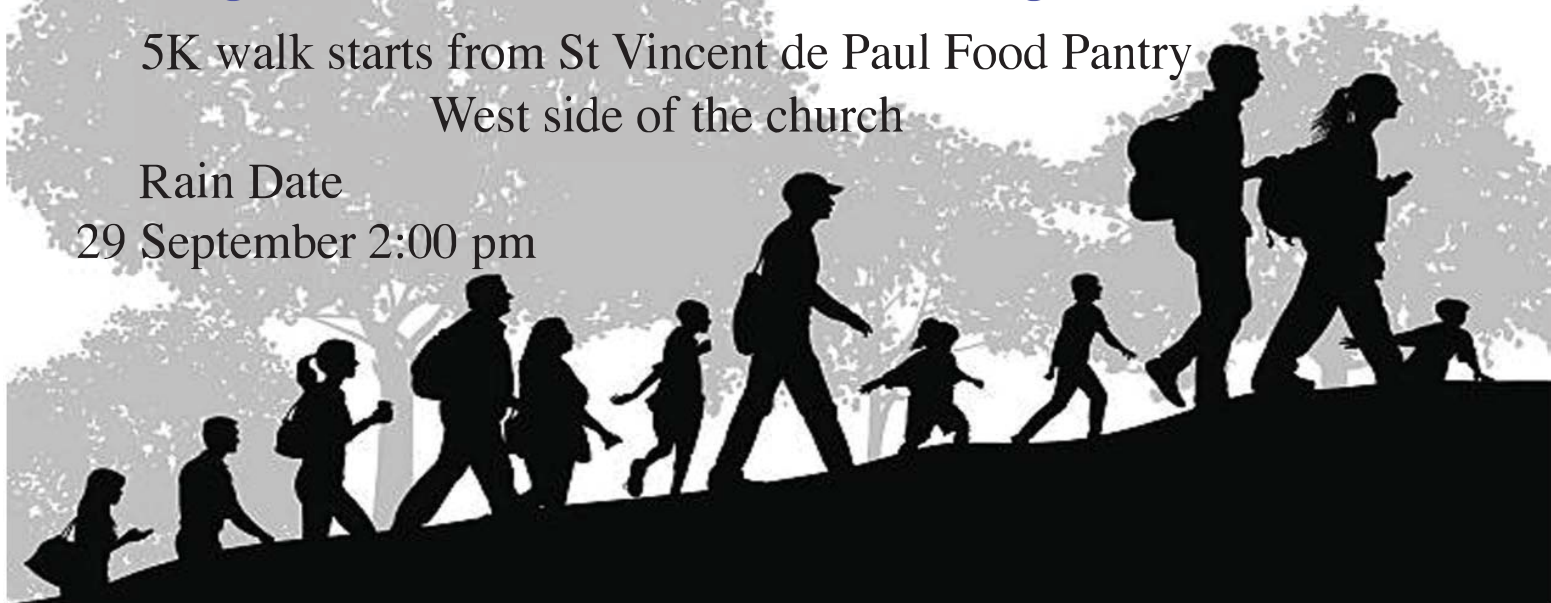
